## Spring Joy Quilt

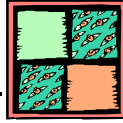
If you are interested in making a block for the Spring-Joy quilt, please see Monica at the next meeting. The majority of the blocks are needle-turn appliqué and need to be turned in by our June 2011 meeting so that they can be assembled in time to be photographed for ticket sales and displayed at our November quilt show.

## The Great 2011 Crayon Challenge

1. Each member who chooses to participate will choose one crayon color at random from a grab bag.
  - a. If you are unable to attend the August or September meeting, contact Monica to get a color picked for you.
2. The color chosen must be the predominant color of the quilt, representing at least 60% of the quilt. Black and/or white and one additional color may be added. Fabric may be purchased or hand-dyed and embellishments are allowed.
  - a. It is acceptable to use lighter and darker shades of your crayon in addition to the original shade of the crayon to help achieve your desired effect; however, the original shade must be present in the quilt.
3. The quilted item can be of any shape, size, or design, but must be finished including quilting, binding, and label.
4. When turning in your piece, pin your crayon pieces to the outside of your quilt in a baggie.
5. Items are due at the May 2011 meeting.

For those who need a Linus project to stitch, Pat O and Linus committee will have Linus "kits" (fabric cut into blocks and ready to sew) and already pieced tops to be quilted at the next few meetings. The committee does not have any batting, so if you take a kit, you will need to use your own batting. If you took some of the batting that was available last year, and did not or will not use it, please bring it to the meeting.

If you have any prints suitable for children that you can contribute, that would be nice, too. We have lots of fabric, but mostly florals, etc. It should be at least a half yard that can be cut into blocks.

### Warm-'Em-Up Alphabet Soup Mix

1/2 c. pearled barley  
1/2 c. dried split peas  
1/2 c. instant rice, uncooked  
1/2 c. dried lentils  
2 T. dried, minced onion  
2 T. dried, minced celery  
2-1/2 t. salt  
1/2 t. lemon pepper  
2 T. beef bouillon granules  
1/2 c. alphabet pasta, uncooked  
1 c. rotini, uncooked

To serve: Add all ingredients to 3 quarts water in a large pot. Add 2 stalks chopped celery (optional if you use dried minced celery), 2 sliced carrots, one cup shredded cabbage and 2 cups diced tomatoes. Cover and cook over medium-low heat for one hour or until vegetables are tender. Makes 10 to 12 servings.

Note: cubed chicken, beef or pork may be added with other ingredients.

### Upcoming Quilt Show

Cabin Branch and Stone House host a Quilt Show each year in March. The show gives members of both guilds an opportunity to showcase the quilts they have created, and a chance to share the work, and the fun, of the past year with the community. The show offers demonstrations, a children's activity, and a vendor mall. A silent auction, with items made

and donated by guild members, is also part of the show. Two quilts will raffled off and the winners are announced near the end of the show.

This year's quilt show will be held March 12-13, 2011, at the Prince William County Fair Grounds, 10624 Dumfries Rd, Manassas, VA 20110. Hours are Saturday from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., and Sunday from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. The show will have over 200 quilts on exhibit, a merchant mall, silent Auction, raffle quilts, and quilt appraisals. Admission is adults \$5, seniors \$4, and under 12 get in free. Free parking is also available.
